Recently, I was reading an article by Scott Klusendorf from Life Training Institute. In his “The 5-Minute Pro-Lifer,” he was explaining how to defend our pro-life views in 5 minutes or less. It made me wonder...how many of us can defend our views when talking to someone who is adamantly opposed? While the article can be found on his website, www.prolifetraining.com, the excerpt below gives an example of how we can calmly engage in a conversation on a subject that seems to evoke so many reactions.

Just as you may find yourself defending the life of the unborn to those around you, we too at Women's First Choice Medical are committed to do the same. Our mission is to erase the need for abortion in our patient's minds. We do that by developing and maintaining accurate and relevant services to women at risk for abortion. Every appointment with an abortion-minded patient is a sales process and the primary product we provide to abortion-minded women is security...her fear of the unknown changed into confidence for the future.

In the last 2 days, we have seen 6 patients. Out of the 4 positive tests, all 4 are now choosing life for their babies. But, keep praying for them. We have seen women choose life only to leave our center and a few weeks later, due to pressure from significant people in their lives, have an abortion. You never know, you may be speaking to the very person who may influence the decision of the women that we are seeing.

There is no morally significant difference between the embryo that you once were and the adult that you are today. Differences of size, level of development, environment, and degree of dependency are not relevant such that we can say that you had no rights as an embryo but you do have rights today. Think of the acronym **SLED** as a helpful reminder of these non-essential differences:

Size: True, embryos are smaller than newborns and adults, but why is that relevant? Do we really want to say that large people are more human than small ones? ...

Level of development: True, embryos and fetuses are less developed than the adults they'll one day become. But again, why is this relevant? Four year-old girls are less developed than 14 year-old ones. ... Some people say that self-awareness makes one human. But if that is true, newborns do not qualify as valuable human beings. ...

Environment: Where you are has no bearing on who you are. ... How can a journey of eight inches down the birth-canal suddenly change the essential nature of the unborn from non-human to human? If the unborn are not already human, merely changing their location can't make them valuable.

Degree of Dependency: If viability makes us human, then all those who depend on insulin or kidney medication are not valuable and we may kill them.

In short, it's far more reasonable to argue that although humans differ immensely with respect to talents, accomplishments, and degrees of development, they are nonetheless equal because they share a common human nature.
